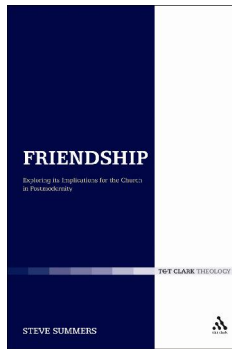


Globalization and the Mission of the Church

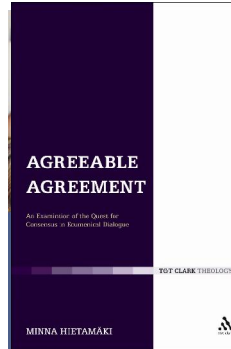
